ON YOUR BIKE

Riding the rail trails of the South Burnett is the perfect cycling trip for the active outdoors nature lover. There are three trails that extend 315 km stretching from Inswich to Kilkiyan!

Start and finish wherever you like. You'll find plenty of accommodation, eateries and watering holes along the way! Choose your trail based on your fitness level.

Make sure you always carry plenty of fluids and snacks with you and plan ahead so you know how far it is to your next stop because there are some sections of the trail without services or supplies for quite long distances.

The Link Routes connects Yarraman at the top end of the Brisbane Valley Rail Trail, to Nanango and then on to Kingaroy showcasing the wonderful countryside around the South Burnett and joining the Kingaroy/Kilkivan Rail Trail which has six mapped and signposted loop rides between Memerambi and Tingoora with a seventh planned to wind through the wineries through Moffatdale.

If you're after more adrenaline packed action, you'll find two dedicated mountain biking tracks: McEuen State Forest, Wondai with 18 - 20 kms of mainly intermediate trails with a direct link from the Rail Trail and Gordonbrook with approximately four and a half kilometres of track (expanding to about 18kms by the end of 2022).

A third track is under construction at the Bunya Mountains to be completed by August 2022.

Out There Cycling



Every year over the 2nd weekend in September Blackbutt comes alive for the Blackbutt Avocado Festival.


Affectionately known as Avofest, the festival is Australia's best and only east coast Avocado Festival.






YARRAMAN FINISH LINE FESTIVAL

WATCH THE BIRDIE

With over 300 recorded bird species, the South Burnett is a bird watchers dream.

The region is known for the Black-breasted Button-quail and Glossy Black-Cockatoo, but there are many more species you're likely to come across if you try some of these local hot spots:

Bjelke-Petersen Dam, Boat Mountain Conservation Park, Nanango Fauna Sanctuary, Wooroolin Wetlands, Gordonbrook Dam and the Bunya Mountains National Park.

Pack your binoculars, a hat and your bird identification book and take a note of how many birds you can identify.



Yarraman Heritage Museum

COME and experience life in the early 1900's at the Yarraman Heritage Museum and Information Centre. Formerly a convent school run by the Sisters of Mercy, it is now a museum that provides interest for the whole family. There are also historical buildings on site, including the Yarraman railway station and Rocky Hill school building, along with an extensive collection of military memorabilia.

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Heading to the Bunya Mountains from Toowoomba, take a pit stop in the tranquil country village of Cooyar, grab a drink at Cooyar Hotel and get the lowdown on what to see and do around the town.

Explore the disused Muntapa tunnel, Queensland's longest straight railway tunnel which now houses a colony of bent winged bats.

Spot a platypus in Cooyar Creek (early morning or on dusk) or take a hike through remnant rainforest and piccabeen palms at the nearby Palms National Park.

Maidenwell, "The Gateway to the Bunyas" on the eastern side, is the last stop for food and fuel before heading on to the Bunya Mountains so grab a coffee and lunch at the Trading Post or a beverage and pub meal on the verandah of the Maidenwell Hotel.

Picturesque Coomba Falls with its deep natural swimming hole is just 2kms from town.

A lovely spot for photography and bird watching and the icy water is refreshing to cool down on a hot day.

The Bunya Mountains rainforest-clad peaks shelter the largest stand of ancient bunya pines in the world.

Discover cool mountains, rainforests and waterfalls, unique range-top grasslands, panoramic views, colourful birdlife and enthralling stories of times long ago.

Relax, unwind and soak up the mountain air in the shade of ancient bunya pines!

Visit a local cafe or throw down a picnic rug while you enjoy spotting brilliantly-coloured king parrots and crimson rosellas and red-necked wallabies feeding on the grass.

Take a hike along one of the walking tracks ranging from a short rainforest stroll to 10km

half-day hikes, pick one to suit your mood.

Choose your own accommodation adventure in the Bunya Mountains, you can camp within the national park by picking up a camping permit through Queensland Parks.

For something more comfortable, the Bunya Mountains Accommodation Centre offers holiday homes across the mountain top.

A tip for the traveller – the temperature at night tends to drop a few degrees because of the high altitude so make sure you pack a jumper!

And no matter what the season don't forget to look up, the stars in this part of Big Sky Country are proof this area is truly magical.







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At the centre of a rich farming district, the small town of Kumbia is nestled in the foothills of the Bunya Mountains and last chance for a fuel stop on the northern side before heading up the mountains.

Known for its stone-fruit and avocado orchards and heritage signposts, Kumbia is well worth a stop on your trip through the South Burnett region.

The Federation Heritage Centre in Bell Street is well worth a visit. The photo collec-

tion documents people and events as well as historical records and artefacts relating to the early residents of Kumbia.

An interesting golf course built around the local race track provides some very challenging golf. Straight hitting is in order as you are challenged with out of bounds.

Each August the streets of Kingaroy take on a porky shade of pink as bacon fans have some porky fun during a weekend-long sizzling food festival celebrating all things porcine.


Kingaroy Baconfest was born and established in 2018 to highlight the importance of buying 100 per cent Australian pork products.

rush' bike ride or run along the Kingaroy to Kilkivan rail trail and cooking masterclasses from guest chefs.


The festival also hosts the Sunpork smokeoff barbecue competition each year, bacon olympics and plenty of fun for the whole family.

Right on the Kingaroy-Kilkivan Rail Trail, situated just the right distance from the last pit stop if you're cycling or hiking, are the towns of Wooroolin and Tingoora.

Perfect to make a rest stop and grab a drink or a meal at the local watering holes.

Both towns have a free 24 hour rest stop for campers and caravaners that are situated in the centre of the town.

Grab a meal and a drink and check out the Farm 2 Fork Collective shop to take home some local produce or take a walk to view the early 1900s railway station which has been returned to town and showcases local history.

For the avid birdwatcher, pack your walking shoes, picnic, hat, bird book and binoculars and record your own list of sightings in the nearby Wooroolin Wetlands.

It's complete with a bird hide for naturalists to fully appreciate resident and migratory fauna.







Matthew Langdon

Multiple Australian Bass Pro Tournament winner with 2 international top 10 finishes in the United States and South Korea.

2018 & 2020 Australian Angler of the Year title holder and currently leading the 2021 title race.

Tell us a bit about yourself

I'm a passionate freshwater angler living in the South Burnett because of its rich fishing potential and access to a variety of creeks, rivers and dams in the area.

I grew up in St George, South West Queensland, fishing for Yellow Belly and Murray Cod.

Happily married with two children, I'm a part-time high school teacher and local fishing guide catering for anglers willing to learn in South East Queensland, North Burnett and Central Queensland helping anglers target Australian Bass, Saratoga and Yellow Belly. I started my business Australian Freshwater Fishing Charters in 2017.

Have you got any fishing tips for budding anglers?

My best advice is to fish as often as possible at as many places as you can, targeting a variety of species and try to learn one particular species very well. Time spent on the water is the best way to learn more about our dams and our fish species.

Fishing with experienced anglers or a fishing guide is a fast way to learn.

If you go to our dams during the week they're generally quiet and I like to fish from lunchtime onwards as this is when the water is generally at its warmest and the fish are most active.

Your best kept secret fishing spot?

It would have to be Lake Boondooma in the South Burnett and Lake Cania in the North Burnett, both dams have a variety of species with beautiful scenery.

What do you like about the South Burnett?

The region has a lot to offer when it comes to fishing. We have some great dams and creeks to get out and explore. It's a great tourist destination with plenty to do.



The dam was built in the 1980s to supply water to Tarong Power station and has a surface area of 2500 acres, guaranteeing ample space on the water for all activities – be that angling, swimming, sailing or water skiing.

The homestead and outbuildings are still in their original location and onsite caretakers are available to provide you with a guided tour if required.

Pick up the "Proston Heritage Trail" brochure from the library to get a glimpse of what life was like here in the 1920s and '30s or take time out to contemplate and reflect at the Community Labyrinth.


Well worth a visit is the restoration workshop of the Murgon Men's Shed group at the old Murgon railway station.
